## ETYMOLOGY

Be able to match ALL meanings to the following prefixes and suffixes:

## SHAKESPEARE / ROMEO & JULIET/ A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM

- Know Shakespeare's biography [review lit book info]
- Know important literary terms from this section (definition and common examples from the plays): dramatic irony, foil, comic relief, prologue, internal conflict, external conflict, tragic flaw, dialogue, soliloquy, tragedy, blank verse, aside, tragic hero, monologue, foreshadow, comedy, name meanings,
- *Romeo and Juliet & A Midsummer Night's Dream* – characters, plot, setting, examples of lit terms found in the play, themes, background of both
- Know the Shakespearean Theater: similarities and differences to today's theater

## POETRY

- Terms: sonnet (Italian/English); lyric, prose, dramatic poetry, narrative poetry, haiku, meter, foot, rhythm, rhyme scheme, iambic, pentameter [review poetry test for these specific terms]
- Apply them in the context of a real poem

## DIAGRAMS

- Know how to diagram: verbals, verbal phrases, independent clauses, noun clauses, adverb clauses, adjective clauses, sentence structures
  - You will NOT be writing your own
  - You WILL be identifying aspects of the diagram in a multiple choice, true/false or matching format
